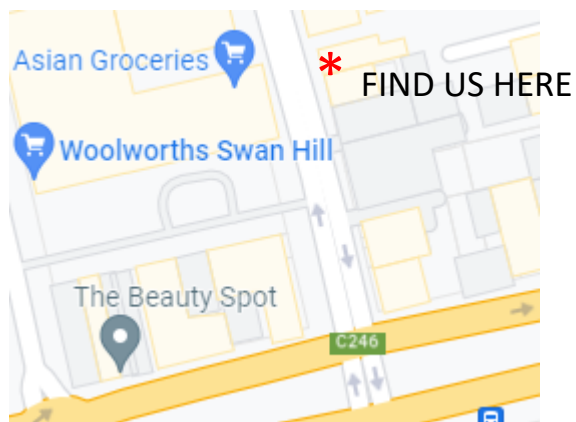

Aims

The Refugee Health Program aims to:

- Increase refugee access to primary care services
- Improve how health services respond to refugees' needs
- Help individuals, families and refugee communities improve their health and wellbeing

The Refugee Health Nurse can provide support with:

- Health literacy – understanding diagnoses and medication
- Health assessments
- Health education and advocacy
- Support to access a Doctor (General Practitioner)
- Support attending specialist appointments and assistance with co-ordinating specialist medical appointments
- Referral to other services as required such as allied health, counselling

Eligibility

The Refugee Health Program targets newly arrived people from a refugee background or who are asylum seekers.

The term 'refugee' is generally used to refer to people who have arrived in Australia under the Australian Government's Humanitarian Program. Most refugees living in Victoria have arrived through the Humanitarian Program. A broader definition of 'refugee' includes all people who have escaped situations of displacement, conflict and violence, so includes people seeking asylum in Australia or who came on a non-Humanitarian Program visa but from a refugee source country.

Accessing this service

If you are a refugee or asylum seeker you can ask to see a Refugee Health Nurse.

- Come to Community Health and ask for an appointment
- Ask a friend or family member to contact us on your behalf
- Ask another agency worker to contact us
- Ask your doctor to refer you to us
- Phone us and ask us to call you back with an interpreter
